

TOURNAMENT INFORMATION

TOURNAMENT DAY SIGN-IN

On tournament day, sign-in at the golf Shop desk at least 30 minutes prior to your tee time. The foursomes are entered so that the fast players (generally lower handicaps) are in the early groups and slower players (higher handicaps) following. There should not be a hole open in front of your foursome without making some effort (**READY GOLF**) to close the gap.

READY GOLF

READY GOLF is a name given to play that you don't see on the Pro Schedule on TV. To play Ready Golf, a foursome would: At the Tee let the first player ready hit his ball no honors. (Remember to watch each other's tee shot, so that time is not wasted if the ball is not located immediately). If a player believes his ball may be lost outside a water hazard or out of bounds, to save time, he should play a provisional ball.

If there is a gap or opening between your group and the one in front, the first person that holes out goes to the next tee and hits while the rest putt out. (If a person needs help seeing the tee ball, two people proceed to the next tee).

In the fairway go to your ball and hit when it is safe to do so without waiting for the person farthest from the hole to hit. When riding in a cart drop one player at his ball with the other going to his, when practicable, then hit, pickup the partner and move on for the next stroke.

Always place your golf cart or bag so that you can leave the green from the rear or side toward the next tee. Not in front so that you obstruct the next group. If a player needs to rake a greenside bunker someone on the green should be putting not waiting for the raker to putt his ball. Line-up and look over your putt while the other players are doing the same and be ready to putt when it is your turn. When practicable you should putt out, not mark and wait. (See 2 above). Mark your scorecard at the next tee while waiting your turn to tee off.

POSTING

The Handicap Committee will determine your adjusted score(s) from the score cards and post them to the GHIN and LPSGC Scoring Records after each tournament. Remember to review the adjustments by visiting the [HANDICAPS](#) link on the main page after each event and report any problems to the Handicap Chairman.

CLUB CHAMPIONSHIP

Policy regarding Low Gross and Low Net Champions for the Annual Club Championship:

1. To be eligible to compete for the Club Championship Trophy/Prize, a member must have posted at least five (5) rounds of golf played during regular Club tournaments throughout the year.
2. Club members with less than 5 posted rounds may still enter the tournament and compete for flight prizes, as in any other Club tournament.

DEFINITIONS:

- A. The Club Championship Tournament is held to determine Low Gross & Low Net Champions.
- B. Posted rounds are scores used to determine your index/handicap.
- C. A regular Club tournament is defined as a tournament played at the Las Positas Golf Course.
- D. The LPSGC year is December 1 to November 30.
